

## Combination Sale Kicks Off Fall Sale Lineup

The heat tolerant Jersey breed barely broke a sweat in the 100-degree weather as they coasted to a \$2,287 average on the 123 lots.

The ninth annual Bush River & Treasure Chest Combination Sale was hosted by J. J. "Doc" Malnati and Richard Doran of Bush River Jerseys on September 8, 2008, following the Dixie Invitational and Southeast Heifer Growers North Sale.

The combination sale, featuring the Bush River herd, owned by Richard Doran and the Treasure Chest herd, owned by Kevin Lutz, has made a tradition of only accepting consignments from previous buyers in their sale. This year 46 consignors offered buyers 123 lots from the cream of their herds. Twenty-eight buyers from 17 states purchased the deep pedigreed animals for an average of \$2,287 and a total gross of \$281,315.

Strong maternal pedigrees are prominent in this sale with the high seller having just that.

Topping the sale was a six-month-old calf out of Vantage Lemvig Mammie, Excellent-90%. "Mammie" currently ranks 10th in the nation for JPI at +301. Her P9 daughter, TJF/Lee Lexntn Mamme 792, topped the Bush River sale for \$6,200.

"Mammie" has made a name for herself around the country. Her offspring have been in high demand in 2008 as well. "Mamme" has a best 305-day record of 4-4 3x 27,440 4.8% 1,316 3.6% 996 84DCR. She has a PPA of +5,135M, +337F, and +212P. She sold as a five-year-old in TheAll American Sale in 2005.

The six-month-old heifer is sired by Woodstock Lexington-ET, JPI +148, and was purchased by David Allen, Reedsburg, Wis. "Mamme 792" has a Parent Average (PA) of +781M, +68F, +43P, +\$485CM, +\$446NM, +\$380FM, and a

JPI of +225, which ranks her among the top 10% of her peers.

Five maternal sisters rank among the Top 300 of the JPI cow and heifer lists. Additionally, she has four maternal brothers in A.I. with numerous other brothers that have pending A.I. contracts. A first choice female sired by Forest Glen Action-ET, JPI +173, and out of "Mamme" sold in the 2008 National Heifer Sale.

The partnership of Taylor Jersey Farm and Lynn Lee, Booneville, Miss., consigned the heifer.

Three offspring of former World Production Champions garnered the next three high prices of the sale.

The second high seller was a choice of two bred heifers out of Sunset Canyon Ren Goldie-ET, Excellent-90%. Herby and Amanda Lutz, Chester, S.C., selected Sunset Canyon Centurion Golden-ET for \$5,100. The bred heifer sired by Sooner Centurion, JPI +73, is due in late March to Lester Sambo, JPI +67.

"Goldie" produced her best 365-day record of 24,786M, 1,135F, and 926P at 3-7 DHIR. She was the third junior two-year-old at the 2003 Western National Jersey Show and has two sons in A.I.

The next dam, Ferreira Jason Gold-ET, Very Good-88%, is sired by Sunset Canyon Jason-ET, JPI +44. The next dam, is the one and only—Golden MBSB Of Twin Haven-ET—the former world fat champion. The daughter of Mason Boomer Sooner Berretta, JPI +62, has a best 365-day record of 34,876 6.9% 2,421 4.1% 1,424 DHIR. She was Excellent-94% and the first Jersey to produce over 2,000 lbs. of fat.

"Golden" was consigned by Trinity Jersey Farm, Newberry, S.C.

Selling for the third high price of the day was a P8 bred heifer due in the early spring to SC Gold Dust Paramount Iatola-ET, JPI + 166. QA/WF Lieutenant

Destiny-ET, was purchased by James R. Albers, Dalhart, Texas for \$4,500.

Her dam, QA/WF Hallmark Delirious, Excellent-90%, is the former world record holder for protein and cheese yield. She produced a high record at 4-1 365 44,611 5.4% 2,411 3.7% 1,641 DHIR 5,676CY. The next dam is Berretta Diva, Excellent-91% with 19,000 lbs of milk. The third dam, Vantage Pitino Donna, Excellent-93% produced 24,760 lbs. milk, 1,188 lbs. fat, and 973 lbs. protein at 6-1.

"Destiny" was the winning senior heifer calf at the 2007 Kentucky National. She has a maternal sister that is appraised Excellent-91% with 24,550 lbs. milk, 1,400 lbs. fat, and 866 lbs. of protein at 2-2.

She was consigned by John McReynolds, III, Starkville, Miss.

Another well-known production family was represented by the fourth high seller. A five-month-old heifer calf, SC Gold Dust Jacinto Pride A-84, is a direct decent of Sunny Day Yankee Becky, Excellent-90%, the former world champion milk producer and first Jersey to produce four consecutive records of 30,000 lbs. milk. "Pride A-84," was purchased by David Allen for \$4,300.

The P9 daughter of Mason Lemvig Jacinto-ET, JPI +196, carries a PA of +971M, +56F, 37P, and a JPI +193. Her Very Good dam, WF/Sunny Day Futurity Bride, is sired by Sunset Canyon Futurity-ET, JPI +148, and has a projected m.e. of 20,921M, 906F, 716P at 2-0. The grandam, Sunny Day Montana Belinda, Excellent-91%, ranks on the Top 1½% list for JPI at +211. She produced two records over 21,200 lbs. of milk and three records with over 1,000 lbs. fat. The third dam, Sunny Day Bold Belinda-ET, Excellent-94%, is sired by MVF Bold Venture Daniel, JPI +115. She produced a best 365 day record of 38,557 lbs. milk, 1,802 lbs. fat, and 1,411 lbs. protein at 6-1. The fifth

dam is "Becky" with 36,380 lbs. milk, 1,299 lbs. fat, and 1,257 lbs. protein.

She was consigned by Gold Dust Syndicate, Newberry, S.C.

Selling for the next high price of the day was Canyon Polly, a Sunset Canyon Matinee-ET, JPI +182, out of Legion Polly, Excellent-92%. This year, Legion Polly, was named Supreme Champion of the Kentucky Kow-A-Rama Junior Jersey Show and Reserve Grand Champion of the Kentucky Kow-A-Rama Jersey Show. Additionally, she was Grand Champion at the Kentucky National Show and the Illinois State Fair.

This well-recognized family is backed by the third dam, Duncan Belle, Excellent 3 in Canada. Duncan Belle was a two time Grand Champion at the Royal Winter Fair (1992 and 1993) and Grand Champion at the 1991 World Dairy Expo. Besides winning in the show ring, she produced 21,029 lbs. milk, 1,162 lbs. fat, and 888 lbs. protein at 6-0 in Canada. The next three dams are all appraised Excellent with over 17,400 lbs. milk.

The five-month-old heifer calf was purchased by River Valley Farm, Tremont, Ill., who in addition are the owners of her dam, Legion Polly. Canyon Polly, was consigned by Brooks Rankin, Greensboro, Ala.

The volume buyers for the sale were Dias Family Dairy, Hilmar, Calif., purchasing 24 head for \$60,300; John Yoder, Loudonville, Ohio, purchasing 16 head for \$37,300; and Ray and Susanne Quaresma, Manteca, Calif., purchasing 16 head for \$29,235.
